Key Implementation Criteria:

1. Whole class instruction.
2. All teacher-directed lessons prepared as scripts to help convey information to the class.
3. Peer-mediated instruction in assigned pairs.
4. Teacher Lessons and Pair Practice are the two major components of the PALS Math intervention.

Program Skills:

1. Number recognition
2. Comparing numbers
3. Addition and subtraction concepts
4. Place value
5. Missing addends
6. Multiplication and division concepts
7. Concepts and applications – Includes a variety of topics from counting to fractions to word problems.
